We act with uncompromising honesty, respect and fairness with the survivors we serve, with our community and with each other. We welcome questions and we answer sincerely.

We're here for all survivors and for each survivor. Our language and our work are informed by each survivor's context, stage, dignity, and right to self-determination and are more important than our own agendas or the systems within which we work.

We are here to change things. Regardless of traditional mindsets, power structures and norms, we welcome the challenge of stepping out and speaking up. We work within an intersectional, feminist, and anti-racism/anti-oppression framework and we honour each other's courage in doing this work.

Gillian's Place respects human rights. We are a place where Two-Spirit, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, questioning, intersex, asexual, aromantic, and all gender- and sexually-diverse folks are welcomed and supported.
